OLD TESTAMENT VALUES EXHIBIT B: debt protection
You cannot take away someone's <u>Living</u> because they owe you money.
Not only can you not take their livelihood you can't even take their dignity during collection.
God runs the world this way because "You are only foreigners and
tenant farmers <u>working</u> for me." —Leviticus 25:23
